

JJRI FUNDING BY REGION


JJRI funding is available statewide, providing increased access to services that positively impact individuals and communities


FFT was the first of the JJRI programs to begin offering services.

Youth can access JJRI services by referral from the Unified Judicial System, Department of Corrections, Child Protection Services, schools, parents, and other community programs.

FFT OUTCOMES

Families, adolescents and therapists have seen positive changes as a result of JJRI programing, but JJRI services continue to evolve. New services have been implemented in innovative ways to enhance access and ensure programing meets the needs of South Dakota youth.
